Welcome to the 21st New Hampshire Film Festival, a celebration of cinema, culture and artistic excellence that stirs our emotion and enriches our community. This year, Portsmouth is buzzing with excitement as it celebrates its 400th year anniversary, a significant milestone marking centuries of rich history and connections among its citizens. We are thrilled to share in this special time by delving deep into the spirit of storytelling to touch our hearts and souls as filmmakers and film enthusiasts alike. We have an especially stellar set of movies coming your way and we can't wait for you to see what's in store!

Filmmakers coming from near and far to share their passion will quickly discover our centuries-in-the-making community of passionate supporters that keep them returning year-afteryear. The alumni in this year's program are impressive, including Brittany Snow's feature directorial debut Parachute, Sean Price Williams' directorial debut The Sweet East and David Abel's unbelievable documentary *In the Whale*. We are also fortunate that many creative pioneers call our bucolic state home, forging their contributions to the world from within our midst. We have been inspired by the award-winning works of Ken Burns and his Florentine Films, Nancy and Brian Vawter's Atlantic Media, Marc Dole's Hatchling Studios, Chase Bailey's Left Bank Films, Meagan Frappiea and Bryant Naro's Slate Roof Films, Amy Greene and Chris Stinson's Live Free or Die Films, and the prolific Freddie Catalfo, among many others. They have laid, and continue to lay, a foundation of talent and collaboration we are proud to honor. This year's roster of local films is again impressive, and also kismet for our seacoast city's milestone anniversary.

It is also a great time to look back on some of the memorable titles that put New Hampshire in its lens by shooting here, including the beloved 1995 classic *Jumanji* with the late Robin Williams and Neil Jordan's 1999 psychological thriller *In Dreams*. The 2009 comedy *Mystery Team* holds a special place in our minds. Not only did it star Donald Glover with the feature film debuts of Ellie Kemper and Aubrey Plaza, it was made here in Manchester, NH by festival alum Dan Eckman. Two films that even won Academy Awards are also forever tied to the state: 1981's *On Golden Pond*, shot entirely here, and 2019's *Sound of Metal*, shot partially here.

We are extremely pleased to continue the Oscar tradition in New Hampshire as an Academy Award-qualifying film festival for the Short Film Awards. Beginning with our 20th anniversary edition last year, we are thrilled to annually qualify the winners of our Live Action Short Jury Award and Animated Short Jury Award to submit for Academy Award consideration. Part of our mission is to provide a platform for emerging artists to advance their craft, engage with the community, and promote to industry leaders. We can think of no better way to do so than to highlight undiscovered filmmakers for recognition.

One of the greatest New Hampshire advocates for the festival's mission, and for the arts in totality, was the late Commissioner of the Department of Cultural Resources, Van McLeod. Van's imprint on our event, and in-turn our imprint on the wider filmmaking community, is felt each year. To commemorate his memory and endeavor, we created the Van McLeod Award to honor someone from the state who has made a significant contribution to the film and television industry. For this momentous year, it is our pleasure to welcome legendary producer Marcy Carsey back to New Hampshire to receive this poignant award.

Just as Van did, we believe that giving communities access to world-class cinema at a local, grassroots level is necessary for sustaining and expanding this field of work. It is also a powerful means of bringing people together in new and inspired ways. Through this festival, we aim to bridge the gap between cultures and generations, fostering understanding and appreciation for the art of filmmaking. Our success is evident in the quality and breadth of our international program. This year you'll be able to travel as far as the other side of the world, whether to Taiwan for *Invisible Nation* from director Vanessa Hope and producer Ted Hope, or to Japan for Wim Wenders' latest feature *Perfect Days*.

Especially on the occasion of Portsmouth's 400th birthday, we are extremely pleased for the first time to co-present the film festival with one of downtown's oldest arts institutions, The Music Hall! Their incredible venues have hosted our film screenings since the festival moved to Portsmouth in 2004. The Music Hall's breath-taking, 895-seat Historic Theater and recently renovated, 116-seat cabaret style Lounge are the centerpieces of our event. They are complimented this year by screenings at two of our favorite local gathering hubs, 3S Artspace and The Press Room. We'd like to acknowledge the incredible core team of The Music Hall under Executive Director Tina Sawtelle for their commitment to our festival planning and to the arts year-round: Ashleigh Tucker Pollock, Gabrielle-Marie Fugere, Mark Pruett, James Paone, Ryan Klink, Emily McNair, Ilysse Sirmaian, Andrew DeLorenzo, Michael Tucker and Jason Martin.

The New Hampshire Film Festival simply would not be here today without the continuous support and enthusiasm of this dedicated region of moviegoers. We are also deeply grateful for our trusted sponsors who continue to invest their loyalty and commitment with us, including our long-standing supporters Key Auto Group and BankProv. It is our massive joy to share the magic and splendor of film with all of you. 

MORE DETAILED PASS INFORMATION:

- Badges must be worn around the neck at all events (including screening venues, panels and parties).
- VIP-level pass holders are granted exclusive access to the venue until 15 minutes prior to the showtime.
- 15 minutes prior to screening start times, the theater is general admission.
- Access to all screenings is on a space-available basis for all attendees. While VIP-level pass holders will be allowed entry to the theater first, it is recommended that they arrive early for screenings.
- The earlier you arrive for a screening, the greater chance you have of getting a seat.
 - **Venues will sell out.** Individual venue entry tickets will be handed out on a first-come, first-served basis for each seat. Once these tickets are gone, there are no more seats available for that screening.
- Saving seats is not allowed. Only one venue entry ticket will be given per person.
- Latecomers are not guaranteed seats, even with a VIP-level pass.
- All filmgoers must vacate the theaters between screenings. Seats may not be held between screenings. You must exit the theater at the end of a screening to be readmitted for the next screening. This does not guarantee a seat at the next screening. You may have to choose to leave a screening early to requeue for another screening, even if it is at the same venue.
- Photo ID is required to consume alcohol at all festival venues and parties.
- NHFF is not responsible for lost or stolen passes. Lost or stolen passes will not be replaced.











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

Michael Green loves hip hop... but loathes what it's become. The introvert rapper, slash spiteful blogger, has grandiose plans of returning the genre to real artistic purpose. Unfortunately he's failing miserably, which also summarizes his life in general. MARCY CARSEY

Marcy was a partner with Tom Werner in the Carsey Werner Company, responsible for some of the most successful sitcoms in TV history. Born in Weymouth, MA to a dad who worked in the shipyard and a mom who taught her to always go for it, she graduated from the University of New Hampshire and headed to New York City to get a foothold in TV as a network tour guide. Marcy rose through many jobs on both coasts, culminating in being named Head of Series Television at a major network in LA. Her mom cheered. In 1980, she left to form her own production company and later Tom Werner joined her. They had a great run, and now she puts her energies into things like public education, social justice causes and chairing the Hammer Museum board. Marcy has two children, Becky and Pete, and three stepchildren.

THE VAN MCLEOD AWARD

Named for Van McLeod, the former Commissioner of the NH Department of Cultural Resources, this award honors an individual who has made a significant contribution to the film industry, and hails from the state of New Hampshire. An icon in the state's cultural community, Van's work has had an enormous impact on NH's film industry.

All NH-affiliated feature length narrative films are nominated for Best NH Feature Narrative. This award is voted on by the NHFF executive staff.

BEST NH FEATURE DOCUMENTARY

All NH-affiliated feature length documentary films are nominated for Best NH Feature Documentary. This award is voted on by the NHFF executive staff.

BEST NH SHORT NARRATIVE

All NH-affiliated short narrative films are nominated for Best NH Short Narrative. This award is voted on by the NHFF executive staff.

BEST NH SHORT DOCUMENTARY

All NH-affiliated short documentary films are nominated for Best NH Short Documentary. This award is voted on by the NHFF executive staff.

BEST NH PERFORMANCE

The 2023 New Hampshire Film Festival recognizes the best films in several categories by presenting our Granny Awards. The Granny is a celebration of NHFF's award-winning films and also pays homage to our beloved Granite State. Weighing in at about 20 pounds, the Granny is surely the most physically significant award in the film industry.

ACADEMY AWARD® QUALIFYING FESTIVAL FOR THE SHORT FILM AWARDS

The New Hampshire Film Festival was named an Academy Award® qualifying festival for the Short Film Awards by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences beginning with its 20th annual edition. Short films that receive the festival's Live Action Shorts Jury Award and Animation Shorts Jury Award may now qualify to enter the Short Films competition for the concurrent Oscar® season. Recipients of these qualifying festival awards will be eligible for consideration in the Live Action Short Film and Animation Short Film categories of the Academy Awards® without the standard theatrical run, provided the films otherwise comply with the Academy rules.

GRAND JURY AWARD — DOCUMENTARY AND NARRATIVE

The Grand Jury Awards are NHFF's most prestigious awards, with a prize package for an industry meeting with Oscilloscope Laboratories (Narrative winner) and Factory 25 (Documentary winner). The top three undistributed films in each category are selected by NHFF executive staff, board and programming team as nominees for this year's Grand Jury Awards.

BEST FEATURE NARRATIVE

All feature length narrative films are nominated for Best Feature. Feature length narrative films must be 60 minutes or longer. Selected by the screening committee, board, and executive staff this award recognizes the Best Feature film in NHFF 2023.

BEST FEATURE DOCUMENTARY

All feature length documentary films are nominated for Best Documentary. Feature length documentary films must be 60 minutes or longer. Selected by the screening committee, board, and executive staff this award recognizes the Best Documentary film in NHFF 2023.

AUDIENCE CHOICE — DOCUMENTARY AND NARRATIVE

A sure measure of success for filmmakers is winning the Audience Choice Award. Crowds, social media attention, app votes, and audience buzz will determine the Audience Choice Award winners in both the feature narrative and feature documentary categories.

SHORTS JURY AWARD — ANIMATION, DOCUMENTARY AND LIVE ACTION

Highlighting NHFF's love of the short subject medium since its inception are three juried short film awards. Decided upon by two new juries (one for narrative material and the other for documentary), the top films in each category are nominated by NHFF executive staff, board and screening committee.

BEST SHORT COMEDY

All short comedic films less than 40 minutes in length are nominated for Best Short Comedy. Winner is selected by the NHFF screening committee, board and executive staff.

BEST SHORT DRAMA

All short dramatic films less than 40 minutes in length are nominated for Best Short Drama. Winner is selected by the NHFF screening committee, board and executive staff.

BEST STUDENT FILM

Student films of all genres and lengths compete for this award.
