Welcome to the 20TH Annual New Hampshire Film Festival

It was the summer of 2001 and I was sitting in my tiny apartment in New York City on 16th street in Chelsea. I had been working in the casting department for an independent film company that recently went out of business and I was contemplating my next move. My boyfriend at the time was moving to NH and wanted me to join him. NH was not the next move I had envisioned to continue my career path working in the film business, but I was young and broke, the dot com industry had just imploded, and everyone was getting laid off left and right.

Without a job and no way of paying rent, I entertained the thought of taking a piece of the film industry with me to NH to start a new life with Zac, now my husband of 18 years, and embark on a journey to start a film festival. So, I began with a search on my roommate's old desktop computer to find anything and everything film-related in NH. To my surprise, I came across something in Derry, NH called the New Hampshire Film Expo that touted a modified version of the state's motto as their tagline: "Live Film or Die!" It was a brand-new film festival and its first ever edition was scheduled to open a few months later on Sept. 14, 2001. I immediately opened Hotmail and sent a hopeful message about getting involved, but I never heard back...

Shortly after I left NY and moved to NH in early September 2001, the world we all once knew was changed forever and a film festival was the last thing on my mind for the time being. Meanwhile over in Derry, the New Hampshire Film Expo crew was scrambling to figure out what to do with their festival. Postponement was considered, but the show ultimately went on. The first annual NHFX got off the ground and into the books. It was exactly what the community needed following the horrific events of 9/11 and the festival was a huge success, playing 45 films over three days to over 1,000 attendees in two screening venues.

Two years later, I was working as the events manager for the Portsmouth Chamber of Commerce when I received a call... a call that would change the trajectory of my life (actually more like take over the next 20 years of my life!). It was Judy Krassowski, the finance director of the New Hampshire Film Expo. She was calling the chamber to explore the option of moving NHFX from Derry to Portsmouth, having no knowledge of my attempt to reach out to them a couple years earlier. Each new edition of NHFX was bigger than the year prior and Derry didn't have the infrastructure to support its future growth. I couldn't believe my ears. Mostly because I thought "You can't move your festival to Portsmouth because I'm going to start a film festival in Portsmouth!" But wait, maybe I couldn't (still at this point I actually had never produced a film festival). Maybe rather than have competing film festivals, we could join forces and make something better together. Little did I know, that notion would be the start of something greater than I ever imagined. First I

had to get over the fact they never responded to my email of course! Then I had to get over the name (it wouldn't be until 2007 when we changed from NH Film Expo to NH Film Festival)! But before I knew it, I was in my car heading to my first ever NHFX meeting with the original crew: Chris Proulx, Brett Parker, Judy Krassowski and Dan Hannon (who to this day is still by my side running NHFF!). I had no idea 20 (plus 2) years later the NH Film Festival would be a world class film festival attracting over 10,000 attendees, showcasing 140 films (over 2,000 films over the past 20 years), and earning one of the greatest honors by being named an Academy Award® Qualifying Festival for the Short Film Awards.

It's truly hard to imagine how far we've grown from our early days. But when you look at our loyal supporters, it's no wonder we are where we are. When most of the community couldn't understand what we were trying to accomplish when the festival moved to Portsmouth, The Provident Bank (now BankProv) signed on as one of our first sponsors and remain one of our biggest advocates to date. Vital has been our amazing marketing partner since 2004, donating endless hours of design time to make the festival look as good as it does. Portsmouth Chevy and Key Auto Group signed on right behind them, giving us fleets of cars in addition to their incredibly generous sponsorship. BankW Staffing, Avery Insurance, Access Sports Medicine, CSNH, newly returning sponsor Francis Ford Coppola Wines, and so many wonderful advertisers have been by our side for well over a decade. We truly would not be where we are without all of their generosity.

To all of our filmmakers and our film lovers, we are beyond excited to finally bring you this year's 20th Anniversary edition - welcoming exciting new venues such as Jimmy's Jazz & Blues Club, the freshly renovated Music Hall Lounge, MONA of Portsmouth and St. John's Thaxter Hall. Together with our returning partners The Music Hall Historic Theater, 3S Artspace, the Press Room, and the Seacoast Repertory Theatre - and also with the help of the City of Portsmouth, our participating restaurants and after-party venues - NHFF is back and going to be better than ever. To my partners in crime, my NHFF ride-ordies Dan Hannon, Ian McCarthy, Carrie Forbes and Nick Edgar, and our incredible support team of volunteers, you did it! Thank you for your hard work and dedication. I am grateful for each and every one of you. You made it to the 20th Annual NHFF post-covid and together we are incredibly honored to share it with all of you. In homage of our roots, we now invite you to sit back, leave your everyday life behind, immerse yourself in the incredible stories these amazing artists have entrusted with us, and "Live Film or Die!"

MORE DETAILED PASS INFORMATION:

- Badges must be worn around the neck at all events (including screening venues, panels and parties).
- VIP pass holders are granted priority access to the venue until 15 minutes prior to the showtime.
- 15 minutes prior to screening start times, the theater is general admission.
- Access to all screenings is on a space-available basis for all attendees. While VIP pass holders will be allowed entry to the theater first, it is recommended that they arrive early for screenings.
- The earlier you arrive for a screening, the greater chance you have of getting a seat.
 Venues will sell out. Individual venue entry tickets will be handed out on a first-come, first-served basis for each seat. Once these tickets are gone, there are no more seats available for that screening.
- Saving seats is not allowed. Only one venue entry ticket will be given per person.
- Latecomers are not guaranteed seats, even with a VIP pass.
- All film-goers must vacate the theaters between screenings. Seats may not be held between screenings. You must exit the theater at the end of a screening to be readmitted for the next screening. This does not guarantee a seat at the next screening. You may have to choose to leave a screening early to requeue for another screening, even if it is at the same venue.
- Photo ID is required to consume alcohol at all festival venues and parties.
- NHFF is not responsible for lost or stolen passes. Lost or stolen passes will not be replaced.







SCREENPLAY FINALISTS

Beggar's Bay

A remote and squalid town in a state of constant fear and isolation serves as the home to many sorts, some with the potential to make true change, and others who've fallen victim to their environment. A destitute and debt-ridden sailor driven by pure ego to start his own fishing business is quickly thrust into action after his boat is set ablaze in the middle of the night, by whom we do not know. A young Steven Spielberg, charged with a major blockbuster, attempts to salvage both the film and his sanity as the production spirals into chaos.

STEPHEN DELOS TREACY

Winter Bird

Winter Bird hinges on a subconscious connection between two Alaskans. One a former physician, now Rare Book Room Librarian, who helped his beloved wife commit suicide a few years ago. The other, a subarctic entity, who was brutally murdered while pregnant 100 years before. The librarian becomes intrigued by the amber-eyed blonde who is hell-bent on obtaining a rare set of herb books to heal her foundling infant. Based on indigenous legend, this mythical shape-shifter still haunts the desolate woods near Anchorage, sometimes as a snowy owl, in an effort to share the full horror of her origin. Seemingly interested in the librarian, she vanishes abruptly.

ACADEMY AWARD® QUALIFYING FESTIVAL FOR THE SHORT FILM AWARDS

The New Hampshire Film Festival has been named an Academy Award® qualifying festival for the Short Film Awards by the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences beginning with our 20th annual edition. Short films that receive the festival's Live Action Shorts Jury Award and Animation Shorts Jury Award may now qualify to enter the Short Films competition for the concurrent Oscar® season. Recipients of these qualifying festival awards will be eligible for consideration in the Live Action Short Film and Animation Short Film categories of the Academy Awards® without the standard theatrical run, provided the films otherwise comply with the Academy rules.

GRAND JURY AWARD – DOCUMENTARY AND NARRATIVE

The Grand Jury Award is NHFF's most prestigious award, with a prize package for an all expenses paid trip for the director or producer to an industry meeting with Oscilloscope Laboratories (Narrative winner) and Factory 25 (Documentary winner). The top three undistributed films in each category are selected by NHFF executive staff, board and screening committee to compete for this year's Grand Jury Awards.

BEST FEATURE NARRATIVE

All feature-length narrative films are nominated for Best Feature. Feature-length narrative films must be 60 minutes or longer. Selected by the screening committee, board, and executive staff, this award recognizes the Best Feature film in NHFF 2022.

BEST FEATURE DOCUMENTARY

All feature length documentary films are nominated for Best Documentary. Feature length documentary films must be 60 minutes or longer. Selected by the screening committee, board, and executive staff this award recognizes the Best Documentary film in NHFF 2022.

BEST SHORT DRAMA

All short dramatic films less than 60 minutes in length are nominated for Best Short Drama. Winner is selected by the NHFF screening committee, board and executive staff.

AUDIENCE CHOICE — DOCUMENTARY AND NARRATIVE

A sure measure of success for filmmakers is winning the Audience Choice Award. Crowds, social media attention, and audience buzz will determine the Audience Choice Award winners in both the feature narrative and feature documentary categories.

SHORTS JURY AWARD — ANIMATION, DOCUMENTARY AND LIVE ACTION

Highlighting NHFF's love of the short subject medium since its inception are three juried short film awards. Decided upon by two new juries (one for narrative material and the other for documentary), the top films in each category are nominated by NHFF executive staff, board and screening committee.

BEST SHORT COMEDY

All short comedic films less than 60 minutes in length are nominated for Best Short Comedy. Winner is selected by the NHFF screening committee, board and executive staff.

BEST STUDENT FILM

Student films of all genres and lengths compete for this award.


*Registration for next year's Young Filmmakers Workshop opens in the Spring.

Since the workshop's inception, many program alumni have gone on to study film in college and have successful film industry careers.

The workshop is open to high-school aged teens (14-18 years old) and runs Friday through Sunday concurrently with the film festival itself.
